PLAN YOUR WEEKEND

What is Prudential RideLondon?

It's a new annual world-class festival of cycling developed by the Mayor of London, London & Partners and Transport for London in partnership with Surrey County Council. The event is managed by the London & Surrey Cycling Partnership.

On Saturday 3 August up to 50,000 cyclists of all ages and abilities will take part in the Prudential RideLondon FreeCycle, a free ride on closed roads in central London. Spectators will also be able to watch the Prudential RideLondon Grand Prix – junior, hand-cycle and professional women cyclists racing on closed roads in and around St James's Park.

Sunday 4 August will see 20,000 amateur cyclists tackling the Prudential RideLondon-Surrey 100, a 100-mile route on closed roads through the Capital and Surrey. Later that day, 150 professional cyclists will race against each other in the Prudential RideLondon-Surrey Classic, an extended, 140-mile version of the amateur route. It will largely follow the course of the 2011 London-Surrey Cycle Classic and the London 2012 Olympic Cycling Road Races.



Will this affect me?

As you live on or close to the route of the Prudential RideLondon-Surrey 100 and Prudential RideLondon-Surrey Classic, these events (which take place on Sunday 4 August) are likely to affect you. Only central London will be affected by Prudential RideLondon road closures on Saturday 3 August.

What impact will it have on roads and public transport?

There will be an impact on local traffic in large parts of London and Surrey all day on 4 August, with road closures, bus diversions and parking restrictions in affected areas. You won't be able to drive across the course of the route, so if you intend to drive in the affected areas you'll need to plan your route carefully, or consider using public transport instead.

Why are the roads being closed?

The route for the Prudential RideLondon-Surrey 100 and Prudential RideLondon-Surrey Classic on Sunday 4 August must be secured and made clear of any vehicles to help ensure the safety of spectators, local residents and the cyclists who will be taking part.

Roads on the route will close before the events start to install safety barriers, remove traffic lights and islands and clean the roads. After the cyclists from the events have finished passing through your area, we will begin the removal of barriers and signage and reinstate infrastructure that may have been removed.

What time will the roads in my area be closed, and which roads are they?

The roads will be closed from the early hours of the morning on Sunday 4 August and will reopen as soon as it is safe to do so that day.

Any road used as part of the route for the Prudential RideLondon-Surrey 100 or Prudential RideLondon-Surrey Classic on Sunday 4 August will be closed. Roads adjoining the closed route will have restricted access for local residents and businesses and any vehicle left on the route or parked in a suspended parking bay will be removed from the route. Emergency vehicle access will be maintained.



More detailed information specific to your local area, including a local area map and the names of any roads in your borough that will be closed on Sunday 4 August, will be sent to you closer to the time and will be available on the Prudential RideLondon website.
